# EASTER LETTER FROM BISHOP DAVID

#### Dear friends in Christ,

#### Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

As we journey from the quiet sorrow of Good Friday, through the stillness of Holy Saturday, into the radiant joy of Easter morning, we are drawn again to the heart of our faith: that death does not have the final word. Easter Sunday finds us standing together at the empty tomb — with Mary Magdalene and the other women, with Peter and John — as we celebrate the astonishing truth of our faith: that God has restored the world, and each one of us, in the Resurrection of Jesus.

Christ is risen and walks with us — in every step we take, every breath we draw, every moment we live. God touches us with unfathomable love, offering hope and reason for our Easter joy. In the risen Christ, hope is rekindled, love is renewed, and life is restored. But Easter is not only a moment of celebration — it is a call to live each day as people of the resurrection.

In a world that so often feels marked by fear, uncertainty, and division, we are invited to bear witness to another reality — the kingdom of God breaking in among us, where peace, justice, and compassion take root and flourish. The stone has been rolled away. The tomb is empty. Christ walks ahead of us, calling us by name and sending us out to share the good news.

Across our diocese, in churches great and small, on islands and in glens, in cathedrals and at kitchen tables turned into altars, we can see the light of the resurrection shining - and I give thanks for each of you: for your prayers, your faithfulness, your service, and your love.

As we celebrate Easter this year, may we be renewed in our call to follow Christ with courage and joy. May we find strength in our shared life as a diocesan family, and may we always be ready to speak and live the hope that is within us.

### Canon Missioner appointed to the Diocese... with link to Cathedral



The Bishop of Argyll and The Isles is very pleased to announce the appointment of The Revd Canon Paul Watson as Canon Missioner for the Diocese of Argyll and The Isles. It is hoped that Paul will be licensed at a service in St John's Cathedral, Oban in August 2025 as he takes up this new role.

Bishop David says, "I am delighted to share the news of this appointment, and it will be a joy to welcome Paul and Ina to the Diocese in due course. My prayers are with them both as they begin to think about moving, and with the people they will be leaving. Paul has a great deal of experience, enthusiasm and wisdom to share, and I look forward to working with him over the coming years."

Paul is presently serving as the Rector of St James the Less, Bishopbriggs, in the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway. Paul spent many of his school years in India and

Bangladesh where his parents were Baptist missionaries. He returned to the UK and graduated from St Andrews with an MA in Geography with Social Anthropology before spending 9 years working with international students in Glasgow on behalf of Friends International. During this time he was awarded a BD and MTh from Glasgow university before serving his curacy at St Ninians' Pollokshields. Five years were then spent in Sri Lanka with CMS before returning to Aberdeen in early 2009 to St Devenick's, Bieldside and then in August 2017 for St James the Less. He is married to Ina, a psychotherapist and has two adult daughters, two sons in law and a golden labrador called Bella.

Paul will be also assisting in the Cathedral one day a week, and one Sunday a month. We pray that we can become 'spiritual home' for Paul, a place where he and Ina can be rooted, grounded and held in prayer.
