

ORGAN FUND APPEAL 2025

Following the demise of our former Organ, the Vestry are purchasing a replacement from ChurchOrgan World: a MAKIN WINDERMERE 3-46

This instrument was commissioned by and used at Norwich Cathedral whilst their pipe organ was under repair in 2022/3 and as such, will provide a fitting instrument to take us into the next stage of our Cathedral's worshipping life.

Based on the Makin Windermere 3-45, it has additional features which make it a desirably enhanced version. It also has an improved specification on our former Bradford Organ, with a breadth of soundscape and audio quality needed to fulfil the needs of our Cathedral. The cost will be £55,550
