An inaugural concert will follow in due course. We still of course, need to raise the money to pay for the Organ so fundraising will need to continue!





THE SIGNING OF <u>THE SAINT</u> <u>NINIAN DECLARATION</u>

between the Scottish
Episcopal Church and the
Catholic Church in Scotland

will take place in Edinburgh on Tues 16 Sept 2025 – the Feast of St Ninian. The Declaration supports a deepening relationship between Episcopalians and Roman Catholics in Scotland, allowing both to work more closely together while acknowledging that there are distinct differences between the two churches. The historic declaration of friendship will be signed at the capital's two 'St Mary's' cathedrals. The first part of the signing will take place at St Mary's Catholic Cathedral in York Place, and the second part at St Mary's Episcopal Cathedral in Palmerston Place.
